



SESSION ONE

1. What's one decision you've made recently, big or small, that was really hard to choose? (*Bonus: Did it turn out the way you expected?*)
2. Read **Exodus 3:6-10** together. How do you think Moses felt when God called him to lead the Israelites out of Egypt? Would you have responded the same way? Why or why not?
3. In **Exodus 3:11-12**, Moses doubted himself, but God reminded him, "I will be with you." How does knowing God is with us change the way we make decisions?
4. Share a time when you felt God's presence in a tough situation.
5. Moses had lots of excuses (**Exodus 3:11, 4:1, 4:10**). Which of these excuses do you relate to the most when it comes to stepping out in faith? How can we respond to our doubts with trust in God?
6. Read **Proverbs 3:5-6**. What does it look like in your life to "trust in the Lord with all your heart"?
 - Is there a specific area of your life where you need to let go of control and trust God to guide you?

SESSION TWO

1. What part of Zacchaeus's story stood out to you the most, and why?
2. What "ships" in your life might be holding you back from following Jesus fully?
3. What bold steps can you take this week to "burn the ships" and make an irreversible commitment to Christ?
4. How can you make your repentance and commitment public for accountability and encouragement?





SESSION THREE

1. Have you ever had a moment when you felt like the "main character" in your own story—like the coolest or most confident you've ever been? Share it with the group!
2. Read **Daniel 3:16-18** together. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego stood firm even when the consequences were life-threatening. What stands out to you about their response? Have you ever had to stand up for your faith in a challenging situation?
3. Read **Daniel 3:24-25**. God didn't remove Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego from the fire but walked with them in it. How does this change the way you view the difficult situations or "fires" you're facing right now?
4. *Look back at verse 18:* "But even if He doesn't..." This shows a double-edged faith—they trusted God whether He delivered them or not. Is there an area in your life where you need to trust God, even if the outcome isn't what you hope for?
5. What does it mean to "nail your colors" as a follower of Jesus in your everyday life? What's one specific step you can take this week—at school, home, or with friends—to stay faithful and not compromise your faith?
6. Encourage the group to share the "fire" they're facing right now and how they want to stand firm in it. Pray together for courage, strength, and bold faith like Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego to live consistently for God this week!
