Hebrews 11:23-24 (NIV)

By faith Moses' parents hid him for three months after he was born, because they saw he was no ordinary child, and they were not afraid of the king's edict. By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter.

I. Her Confidence

Verse 23 – "By faith Moses' parents ...saw he was no ordinary child."

- The Faithfulness of the Father
- The Stewardship of Her Son

Acts 7:20 (NKJV)

"At this time Moses was born, and was well pleasing to God..."

II. Her Courage

Verse 23 - " . . . they were not afraid of the king's edict."

III. Her Creativity

Exodus 2:2-4 (NIV)

When she saw that he was a fine child, she hid him for three months. But when she could hide him no longer, she got a papyrus basket for him and coated it with tar and pitch. Then she placed the child in it and put it among the reeds along the bank of the Nile. His sister stood at a distance to see what would happen to him.

Deuteronomy 6:6-8 (NIV)

These commandments that I give you today are to be upon your hearts. Impress them on your children. Talk about them when you sit at home and when you walk along the road, when you lie down and when you get up.



IV. Her Compensation

Exodus 2:9 (NIV)

Pharaoh's daughter said to her, "Take this baby and nurse him for me, and I will pay you." So the woman took the baby and nursed him.

Hebrews 11:24-25 (NIV)

By faith Moses, when he had grown up, refused to be known as the son of Pharaoh's daughter. He chose to be ill-treated along with the people of God rather than to enjoy the pleasures of sin for a short time.
