

# Fighting For Forgiveness – Part One Ephesians 4:30-32

Ephesians 4:30-32 (NIV)

"And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, with whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. Get rid of all bitterness and anger and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you."

Bitterness is like drinking poison and hoping the other person dies. Forgiveness is like setting a prisoner free and realizing the prisoner is you.

## I. The Meaning of Bitterness

- Bitterness is a corruption in my spirit that results when I fail to forgive those who have wronged me.
- Bitterness is an inward attitude of deep resentment that produces and excessive desire for revenge.
- Bitterness is harbored hurt simmering in the soul.
